About the Programme

The English + Volunteering Programme at Ara Institute of Canterbury begins with full-time English language study, followed by part-time English language study and part-time volunteering in the community. An upper-intermediate level of English is required for this course, as students interact with people in New Zealand businesses and community organisations.

The programme is available to international students only.

Students are invited to participate in cultural, recreational and sightseeing activities during their stay in Christchurch. These activities vary month to month and include conversation exchanges, cultural clubs and off-site field trips. All activities are optional and students pay any entry fees themselves.

Programme Aims

Programme Content

- English language tuition
- Opportunities to engage in volunteering
- Supervised independent study in the Language Self-Access Centre with experienced Learning Facilitators





Programme Details:

On application, students complete a questionnaire on their prior experience and future plans, and their English language level is assessed.

Our Workplace Placement Co-ordinator arranges suitable volunteering positions, introduces the student to the placement organisation and provides support during the placement period.

Students may be placed in positions involving:

- Being a companion for elderly people
- Helping in schools or after-school activity programmes (police clearance required)
- Tree planting and community gardening
- Preparing and serving food at a homeless shelter
- Conservation activities e.g. beach and river clean-ups
- Tourism
- Recreation
- Caring for rescued animals in a shelter

During the English + Volunteering module, students study English for 12 hours per week and participate in volunteering for approximately 8 hours per week; the timing of the volunteering varies according to availability at the organisation.



Facilities and Services

Students will have access to all facilities and services provided by Ara including:

- Library
- Computer access: free 24-hour internet and computer lab use
- Language Self-Access Centre: staffed by specialist Learning Facilitators; for independent language study, open before and after class
- Bilingual Japanese and Chinese student support advisors
- Homestay advisor
- Cafés and restaurant on campus
- Health centre
- Recreation centre and gym





Teaching and Learning

Teaching staff on the English Language programme are qualified and experienced English language teachers with a background in teaching international students.

Teaching is both interactive and communicative in style and involves students working in groups, individually and in simulated role plays.

As part of their programme, the students will also have access to our state-of-the-art Language Self Access Centre and specialised Learning Facilitator staff.

Accommodation

Accommodation is organized by a local company specializing in looking after overseas students. New Zealand homestay providers have a reputation for being friendly, hospitable and generous with their time to students.

All students are asked to complete a detailed application form before departure from their country. From this form, information relating to students and prospective families will be carefully examined to ensure suitable placements.

Accommodation costs can be paid separately to meal costs if required by institutions.

Payment, Postponements, Cancellations, Refunds, and Amendments

- 1. Payments
- Full payment is required to complete the participant's enrolment in this programme. The payment must be made six weeks prior to the programme starting date.
- 2. Cancellations, Refunds and Amendments:

All cancellations must be received in writing. If the cancellation is made, Ara will refund the payments according to our Refund Policy and in the following manner:

- Participant withdrawing prior to the programme start date: Full refund less NZ\$500 administration fee.
- Participant withdrawing within the first 7 calendar days of study: 80% of tuition fee paid and NZ\$500 administration fee
- Participant withdrawing after 7 calendar days of study: no refund
- No refund of the Homestay placement fee under any circumstances.
- 3. All prices are quoted in New Zealand dollars and include local Goods and Services Tax of 15%
- 4. Ara reserves the right to alter the programme, itinerary or accommodation in the event of unforeseen circumstances (such as extreme weather and road closures) beyond its control. Ara will not be responsible for extra charges incurred due to unforeseen circumstances.
- 5. The programme requires a minimum number of participants to operate. Ara reserves the right to cancel or reschedule the programme due to insufficient demand, unsafe conditions, events beyond Ara's control, or any other reason.
