# ENGLISH LANGUAGE SUBJECT DETAILS

Students are immersed in English at all times during their stay including with their homestay family, during class and throughout the exciting range of educational and cultural excursions that we have on offer. Our aim is for students to return home with an improved sense of confidence in their language ability.

The English language component focuses on developing the students speaking, listening and critical thinking skills. These skills are developed within a wide range of high-interest topics and delivered in small class sizes where we provide a supportive highly interactive environment. This approach not only provides lots of opportunity for intercultural exchange, debates and discussion but it also allows the students to contextualise the English they are learning in the classroom and to be able to confidently apply it to real life situations.



As part of this gap year program, students will have the opportunity to study two Diploma of Business subjects. These subjects are equivalent to first year university subjects and students will be studying with Australian and other international students. Subjects will be recommended to students once they have commenced their English language studies.

#### ACTIVITIES

We require all of our under 18 students to be supervised at all times while on campus. Their Study Tour program will consist of a combination of English classes and a wide range of exciting and educational activities and excursions. Students will be required to participate in all of these events.

Over 18 students have more flexibility and freedom in their program. They can choose to access a wide range of social activities, sports competitions, low cost sight-seeing trips and conversation classes.

Co-ordinators (SRC's) host special activities and events to help bring together UOW College Australia students with local Australian students with the aim of helping international students to settle into their new community.

# ACCOMMODATION

UOW College Homestay is the most popular option for Study Tour students allowing them to live with a caring local family and be immersed in the Australian way of life. Our Homestay program office is located onsite and is coordinated by UOW College Australia staff.

- UOW College Homestay accommodation places students with local English-speaking families.
- Breakfast, dinner and weekend lunches are provided by host families.
- For under 18 students we request that Homestay families do not provide internet access to our students. This is to ensure student safety and to encourage students and families to fully interact and engage with each other.
- For under 18 students, transfers to and from UOW College Australia will be provided daily.
- Over 18 students will be required to make their own way to and from UOW College Australia.
- Over 18 students may be charged up to \$10 per week for internet usage



- Students with special dietary needs (such as allergies) which require host families to adjust their standard family menu to accommodate such needs may be subject to an additional charge. This will be determined on a case-by-case basis after a detailed review of the individual student's needs.
- If a Study Tour group is departing on a morning flight from Sydney International Airport, the group may be required to stay overnight in a Sydney Airport hotel to avoid early morning disruptions to host families. An additional fee will be charged for the overnight accommodation.

# GROUP PROGRAM RESPONSIBILITIES

The purpose of this document is to inform you about each party's responsibilities during your Group Program. This includes classes, activities and homestay.

# What are the students responsible for?

The students are responsible for:

- Behaving in a safe and sensible manner.
- Being polite, respectful and fair and following the local rules.
- Looking after their health and wellbeing and alerting their homestay family or staff member if they are feeling unwell or require any assistance.
- Attending and contributing to classes and completing any assignments in a timely manner.
- Adhering to all protective health measures and indoor capacity limits as advised by UOW College Australia.

#### What are the student's parents/guardians responsible for?

The parents or legal guardians of students aged under 18 years are responsible for:

- Providing the Coordinating Entity of the Group Program with all relevant medical information.
- Telling the student's teachers/group leaders of any student health issues, special needs and dietary requirements.

 Reviewing the Study Tour Program to determine whether their child is capable of undertaking all of the activities in the program.

#### What are the teachers/group leaders of under 18's groups responsible for?

The teachers/group leaders accompanying the students on the Group Program are responsible for the welfare of the students and must:

- Assist with all group activities and homestay drop-off and pick-up.
- Supervise the students during any breaks the students have during the English classes and during activities. (<u>Important: Supervise means that the student is under the control of the</u> teacher/group leader and within their sight at all times).
- Be contactable 24 hours a day for emergencies involving the students.
- Tell UOW College Australia staff of any concerns for a particular student or any general issues as soon as practicable.
- Assist UOW College Australia in implementing its procedure for suspected or confirmed cases of COVID-19 including the isolation and supervision of students.
- Ensure that at least one teacher/group leader is provided for every 15 students.

#### What is UOW College Australia responsible for?

UOW College Australia is responsible for:

- Organising the Group Program
- Being a contact point for the Activities Program and the Homestay providers
- Providing the English language classes
- Supervising the students during the English language classes (but students' teachers/group leaders are responsible for supervision during breaks).
- Ensuring compliance with current health and safety requirements.

#### Who is responsible for the student's Homestay?

The student's Homestay arrangements are organised and provided by UOW College Homestay. The UOW College Homestay team will place students with trusted and approved families who have all completed our UOW College Homestay training and checks. UOW College Homestay will work with students, staff and families to resolve any issues that may arise.

# Who is responsible for the structured activities?

UOW College Australia is responsible for all activities unless otherwise specified. Specified structured activities are organised and provided by the External Activities Provider. These activities are identified in your Program Schedule. The External Activities Provider is responsible for:

- The student during the structured activities
- Providing transport for the student to and from the airport to the student's Homestay accommodation.

#### What are you as the Coordinating Entity of the Group Program responsible for?

As the Coordinating Entity of the Group Program, you are responsible for:



- Acting as a liaison between UOW College Australia and the Study Tour Participants.
- Providing UOW College Australia with students' relevant medical or dietary information.
- Ensuring that the teachers/group leaders undertake their role as supervisors of the students effectively and appropriately.
- Checking your own government's travel advice for the latest travel information including pertaining to COVID-19 and complying with the Australian government's entry requirements.
- Complying and ensuring compliance by students, their parents/guardians and students' teachers/group leaders with the Group Program Responsibilities and the Terms set out in this Study Tour Quotation.

# PERSONNEL

UOW College Australia will appoint key staff to ensure smooth delivery of the Group Program. These staff will include:

- Ms Lauren Flynn, Homestay Coordinator, UOW College Australia
- Ms Coco Toh, Admissions and Study Tour Officer, UOW College Australia
- Ms Marina Wilson, Study Tour Coordinator, UOW College Australia

Key staff members are subject to change at any time at UOW College Australia's discretion.

#### TERMS

On acceptance by UOW College Australia of your booking request pursuant to this Study Tour Quotation, you as the Coordinating Entity of the Group Program agree to comply with the Group Program Responsibilities set out above and to be bound by the following Terms:

- 1. Program Cost and inclusions
  - 1.1. The Program Cost quoted in this Study Tour Quotation is valid only for the period stated in the enclosed letter.
  - 1.2. The Program Cost quoted in this Study Tour Quotation is based on the number of students and accompanying staff ("Study Tour Participants") stated in the Program Cost, and is therefore an estimate that is subject to revision once the number of Study Tour Participants attending the Study Tour is finalised.
  - 1.3. The Program Cost quoted in this Study Tour Quotation includes homestay accomodation and meals per week as stated in the Study Tour Quotation. Whilst UOW College Australia will endeavour to provide the choice of accommodation style (twin/triple/single share) as stated in the Study Tour Quotation, it may not always be possible to do so and UOW College Australia reserves the right to substitute accommodation styles where necessary. In those circumstances UOW College Australia will only refund the amount that the costs for the accommodation style initially requested and paid for exceed the costs for the

- accommodation style actually provided. The Program Cost does not include daily transfers for Study Tour Participants except for under 18's students.
- 1.4. Unless specifically stated under the Program Cost section of the Study Tour Quotation:
  - 1.4.1. the Program Cost does not include any airfares or medical and travel insurance;
  - 1.4.2. arrangements for airfares and medical and travel insurance are the responsibility of the Study Tour Participants. For students travelling on student visas clause 4.1 of these Terms applies;
  - 1.4.3. UOW College Australia will not be responsible for any bank fees which must be borne by the Coordinating Entity of the Group Program or the Study Tour Participant.
- 1.5. All fees in this Study Tour Quotation are in Australian dollars and include GST.

# 2. Documentation requirements, bookings and cancellation

- 2.1. All documentation required by UOW College Australia for the Group Program must be completed and received by UOW College Australia at least six weeks before the Group Program is due to start, or at time of booking if the booking is less than six weeks before the Group Program commencement. For Group Programs requiring a school visit then bookings must be made at least 12 weeks prior to the proposed commencement date to ensure UOW College Australia's compliance with the Department of Education's requirements.
- 2.2. A tax invoice for the non refundable deposit ("the Deposit") of 20% of the total Program Cost (calculated according to the number of students and accompanying staff stated in the Program Cost) will be sent to you as the Co-ordinating Entity of the Group Program.
- 2.3. The Deposit is payable within two weeks of the Co-ordinating Entity of the Group Program receiving the tax invoice or six weeks before the start of the study tour, whichever is the earliest.
- 2.4. There is no binding agreement in place until UOW College Australia has notified you of acceptance of your booking and you have paid the Deposit or made full payment in accordance with these terms. The Study Tour Quotation may be withdrawn or amended by UOW College Australia without notice at any time prior to the acceptance of your booking by UOW College Australia and payment of the Deposit. UOW College Australia retains the right not to accept any booking, which it may do at its discretion in circumstances including but not limited to where it has reached full capacity for your intended dates. In those circumstances UOW College Australia will use all reasonable endeavours to offer you alternative dates or arrangements acceptable to you and UOW College Australia. If such alternative arrangements involve increased costs, UOW College Australia will advise you of these and if the arrangements are accepted by you, you will be responsible for payment of the increased costs.
- 2.5. Full payment of the total Program Cost must be received four weeks prior to the commencement of the Group Program. UOW College Australia may cancel the Group Program where full payment has not been received by this date. Late bookings (bookings made 6 weeks or less prior to the commencement of a Group Program) will require full payment of the total Program Cost to be made within seven days from the date of tax invoice for the total Program Cost which will be issued at the time of booking.
- 2.6. For individual Study Tour Participant cancellation requests received 2 weeks or more prior to the Group Program commencement, a full refund of the Study Tour Participant's Program Costs will be made minus the Administration Fee, Homestay placement fee and any other non-recoverable costs. Non-recoverable costs include costs retained by external service providers including the Department of Education.
- 2.7. For individual Study Tour Participant cancellation requests received less than 2 weeks prior to the Group Program commencement, there will be no refund of any part of the



- Study Tour Participant's Program Costs except in extenuating circumstances, when clause 2.8 below will apply.
- 2.8. Requests for refunds where extenuating circumstances exist will be at UOW College Australia's sole discretion, including where a refund is requested due to cancellation and/or delays due to COVID-19.

## 3. Homestay Relocation

- 3.1. Students must provide Homestay host families and UOW College Australia with at least 7 days' notice, or 7 days' payment in lieu of notice, when requesting relocation to alternative accommodation. UOW College Australia cannot guarantee that a relocation will be possible as relocation is subject to availability.
- 3.2. Students requesting relocation may be responsible for a relocation placement fee. This will be determined by UOW College Australia based on the surrounding circumstances.
- 3.3. Students required by UOW College Australia to move host families due to student misconduct will be required to pay a relocation placement fee.

## 4. Welfare and safety of Study Tour Particpants

- 4.1. Each Study Tour Participant must take out and maintain adequate travel and medical insurances for the entire duration of the Group Program. If the Group Program is 12 weeks or more and a student intends to study under a student visa, the student must take out Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC). UOW College Australia can on request arrange OSHC which will be additional to the Program Cost.
  - 4.2. Each Study Tour Participant must 10 years of age or older. Each Study Tour Participant under the age of 18 years must be accompanied by a suitable guardian who will take responsibility for the safety and welfare of that participant during the Group Program.
  - 4.3. To the maximum extent permitted by law, UOW College Australia and its related bodies corporate exclude all liability, whether in tort, contract or under statute, for any loss, damage, injury or other harm to any Study Tour Participant arising from the Group Program.
  - 4.4. In the event that clause 4.3 is ineffective in excluding UOW College Australia's liability, that liability, howsoever arising, shall, to the extent permitted by law, be limited to a maximum of the amount of the total Program Cost per student.
  - 4.5. UOW College Australia will not be responsible for any costs associated with missed transport connections, errors in transport details and/or failure to attend scheduled activities. Costs associated with these events will be borne by Study Tour Participants.
  - 4.6. In the event of any issue or incident arising in respect of the welfare or safety of any Study Tour Participant, UOW College Australia reserves the right to conduct its own investigation into such issue/incident and you agree to give all reasonable assistance to UOW College Australia in respect of any such investigation.

#### 5. Activities

- 5.1. The External Activity Provider is responsible for all External Provider activities listed in the Activities Program. All activities are subject to availability.
  - 5.2. Due to inclement weather, heavy traffic and other forces beyond our control activities may have to be cancelled or rescheduled to an alternate activity. There will be no entitlement to any refund of any amount of the Program Cost in respect of such cancellation or rescheduling.



- 5.3. All Study Tour Participants must be on time for activities to avoid delaying the program.
- 5.4. For under 18 students' identification lanyards must be worn at all times for safety purposes.
- 6. Travel arrangements and activities outside those planned and coordinated by UOW College Australia
  - 6.1. If Study Tour Participants make arrangements for travel or activities outside of, or instead of, travel or activities planned and coordinated by UOW College Australia, they do so at their own risk. Any responsibility held by UOW College Australia towards Study Tour Participants is suspended during their participation in activities outside of those planned and coordinated by UOW College Australia. UOW College Australia and its related bodies corporate will not be liable for any loss, damage, injury or other harm that may occur to Study Tour Participants or third parties during the carrying out of these activities.
