APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Students must apply on our online application system. Please note students will be asked to upload the following documentation into their online application:

- An original copy of your academic transcript
- An original copy of your English language results (if applicable)
- A Study Abroad and Exchange Supporting Statement Form completed by their home university

Students wishing to live in <u>University accommodation</u> should also complete a separate <u>housing application</u> before the accommodation application deadline. Students who apply on time are guaranteed a place in University housing.

Students will also be asked to <u>submit their study plan</u> as part of the online application. Students will receive instructions about how to enrol in classes (online) after their study plans have been assessed


